These basic kits often include food and water for at least 5 days, pet food and water dishes, medications and your pet's medical records, cat litterbox and cat litter, pet carriers and leashes, and blankets or beds. Also, consider adding a rescue alert sticker to your home to let people know that there are pets inside.

Healthy Teeth and Gums Keeping your pet's teeth and gums healthy will provide a lifetime of health and happiness for your pet.
